Magical Bridge playgrounds are designed to **INCLUDE** people with disabilities. **REMEMBER:** People with disabilities may need different equipment, pathways, or other assistance in order to play. In this activity, you'll explore new or better ways for everyone to play.

HOW TO PLAY



ROLL the die to select a **Disability or Difference**. Circle it below.
Roll again to select a **Play Zone**. Circle it below.



OBSERVE WITH KINDNESS — Think about a person with this disability or difference and the challenges they might face. How might they play in your selected Play Zone. What are the challenges?



IMAGINE ways to make it easier or more fun for them to play. Is it a new piece of equipment, a new way to get around, or an improvement on something already in that Play Zone?



SKETCH (or describe in words) your ideas to make the Play Zone better for people with this disability or difference. Pick your favorite and develop it — draw it on the next page, add detail, and descriptions.
